## I wrote this pattern in two sizes:

1. To fit Size $\mathbf{3}$ years old child ( $92-98 \mathrm{~cm} / 32-38$ inches high child)
2. To fit Size $\mathbf{5}$ year old child ( $110 \mathrm{~cm} / 43$ inches high child)

## Measurements

## Size 3 years

Width at armhole 32 cm ;
Depth of Yoke 18 cm
Length 38 cm
Sleeve length 20 cm from underarm to wrist;
Sleeve length 36 cm from neck to wrist

## Size 5years

Width at armhole 34 cm ;
Depth of Yoke 18 cm
Length 43 cm
Sleeve length 25 cm from underarm to wrist;
Sleeve length 41 cm from neck to wrist

## Material:

Yarn weight: 100\% cotton Sport / 5 ply eg, Catania Solids by Schachenmayr SMC (12 wpi)
Yardage: 136 yards/ 124 meters per 50 g ball

## You'll need:

size 3 years about $\mathbf{3 2 0} \mathbf{g}$ (about 6 and half balls totally)
size 5 years about 370 g (about 7 and half balls totally)

## Colors used

## Size 3 years:

205 (apple green)
114 (hot pink)
222 (light pink)
106 (white)
254 (brown-grey)
165 (light blue)

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Size 5 years:
222 (light pink)
114 (hot pink)
189 (orange)
113 (violet)

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Hook size: 3 mm
Gauge of the pattern: 12 sts and 9 rounds $=5 \mathrm{~cm} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ measured over yoke pattern

100\% cotton Camilla by Madame Tricote Paris could also be used ... it has the same wonderful bright colors and is a very similar yarn.

## Other materials:

Four buttons about $1 / 2$ inch ( 1.5 cm ) in diameter; $3 / 4$ inch ( 2 cm ) maximum (I used Dress it up buttons) some beads.

## Note:

As the title says, this is a revised version of my original pattern - version February 2013. I am really sorry I confused you last time.. I spent many time again to write new version, so I hope, that this time, it will be clear now all. If you find something confusing, please write me on this e-mail: vendula.maderska@seznam.cz
Dear girls, I am very happy you like my design, but please noticed, that this pattern is not to teaching you to crocheting pattern, you should know basic skills.

This cardigan is not difficult to make. The hardest part is probably the yoke ... you need to keep counting the stitches on every round to be sure the increases line up properly. Working from the neck edge down, the chart below gives instructions for the yoke. After Row 24, separate the yoke into two fronts, the back, and two sleeves.

## Please read ALL notes carefully before starting to avoid having to rework.

## Note 1

I have made this cardigan in various color combinations; I decided leave only two 3

## Note 2

The yoke is worked in a 2-round pattern ... 1 row of DC followed by 1 row of SC. Count the number of stitches while working every round to avoid having to rework rounds.

Note 3 - very important
Begin every round of DC with 3 CH , then make a HDC in the very first stitch. This beginning $3 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{HDC}$ group counts as the 1st DC (see picture below)
Begin every round of SC with 1 CH , then make the first SC in the first stitch. This beginning $1 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{SC}$ group counts as the 1st SC

## Note 4

At the end of every round turn your work and start the next round as given in Note 2
Working round ends this way gives nice straight edges!

## The color changes for the cardigan:

Size 3 years:
Row 1-4 apple green
Row 5-8 hot pink
Row 9-12 light pink
Row 13-16 white
Row 17-20 brown-grey
Row 21-24 light blue
Row 25 until end white

## Size 5 years:

Row 1-4; 28-30 light pink
Row 5-8; 31-33 hot pink
Row 9-12; 34-36 orange
Row 13-16; 37-39 violet
Row 17-20; 40-42 light green
Row 21-24; 43-45 apple green
Row 25-27; 46-48 turquoise

## Instruction SIIF 5 years old child

Starting at the neckline, CH 108
Row 1: $D C$ into the 4th CH from the hook (the first 3 CH count as the 1st DC here and throughout), then DC into every stitch across; 106 DC; turn work


[^3]Row 2: 1 CH, SC into each DC across; 106 SC
For the following rounds, work from the chart below:

## How to read the chart:

Example row 3: you will make 3 CH as 1 first DC, 1 DC in every 16 stitches from previous row, 3 DC in next stitch, 1 DC in next 19 stitches from previous row, 3 DC in next stitch, 1 DC in next 32 stitches from previous row, 3 DC in next stitch, 1 DC in next 19 stitches from previous row, DC in next stitch, 1 DC in next 16 stitches from previous row (you will have 114 DC at the end of this row).

## Round 25: divide the yoke into Fronts, Back and Sleeves

Work Shell pattern; make 6 Shells (for one front; 36 stitches). Mark the 37 th stitch, then skip the next 55 stitches for the sleeve. To make the DC for the beginning of the next Shell, insert the hook into both the 37th and the 93rd stitches (see picture bellow please), and finish working the DC as usual. Continue working the Shell pattern across the back ( 12 Shells; 72 stitches). Mark the 165th stitch, skip 55 stitches for the second sleeve, then make 1 DC for the beginning of the next Shell by inserting the hook into the marked 165th and the 221th stitches together and finish working the DC. Continue working Shells across the front yoke stitches - maek 6 shells.

## Continue working Shell pattern (see diagram below)

Work across the right front, skip the stitches for the right sleeve, work across the back, skip the left sleeve stitches, then work across the left front.


[^6]Written Shell pattern (lower part of cardigan)
Round 1: 3 CH (counts as 1st DC), skip 2 stitches, ( $3 \mathrm{DC}, 2 \mathrm{CH}, 3 \mathrm{DC}$ ) all in the next stitch, skip 2 stitches, *1 DC, skip 2 stitches, ( 3 DC, $2 C H, 3$ DC) in next stitch, skip 2 stitches*; repeat from * to end; turn
Round 2: $3 \mathrm{CH} *(3 \mathrm{DC}, 2 \mathrm{CH}, 3 \mathrm{DC}$ ) in the 2 CH from the previous round, 1 DC in the 1 DC form the previous round*; repeat from * to end; turn
Round 3: repeat Round 2
Round 4: 3CH, *(3 DC, $2 \mathrm{CH}, 3 \mathrm{DC}$ ) in 2 CH from the previous round, 2 DC in 1 DC from the previous round*; repeat from * to end; turn
Round 5-7: repeat round 4
Round 8: $3 \mathrm{CH}, *(3 \mathrm{DC}, 2 \mathrm{CH}, 3 \mathrm{DC}) 2 \mathrm{CH}$ from the precious round, 2 DC in first DC from the $2 D C$ from previous round, $1 D C$ in the second $D C$ from the $2 D C$ from previous round*; repeat from * to end; turn
Round 10-24: repeat Round 9
There are now 24 Shells; 6 Shells on right front, 12 on back, 6 on left front Work 24 rounds in Shell pattern as follows:
Round 1: work 3 times
Round 2: work 4 times
Round 3: work 17 times

Starting at the neckline, CH 101
Round 1: DC into the 4th CH from the hook (the first 3 CH count as the 1st DC here and throughout), then DC into every stitch across; 97 DC ; turn work

Round 2: 1 CH , SC into each DC across; 98 SC
For the following rounds, work from the chart below:

## Round 25: divide the yoke into Fronts, Back and Sleeves

Work Shell pattern; make 6 Shells (for one front; 36 stitches). Mark the 37th stitch, then skip the next 55 stitches for the sleeve. To make the DC for the beginning of the next Shell, insert the hook into both the 37th and the 93rd stitches, and finish working the DC as usual. Continue working the Shell pattern across the back (11 Shells; 66 stitches). Mark the 159th stitch, skip 55 stitches for the second sleeve, then make 1 DC for the beginning of the next Shell by inserting the hook into the marked 159th and the 215th stitches together and finish working the DC. Continue working Shells across the front yoke stitches - make 6 shells.

There are now 23 Shells; 6 Shells on right front, 11 on back, 6 on left front
Work 19 rounds in Shell pattern as follows:
Round 1: work 3 times
Round 2: work 4 times
Round 3: work 12 times
Now make the sleeves
Left sleeve - size 5 years old child; Work in Rounds with light pink color in DC only.
Round 1: 3 CH (as 1st DC), DC in next 54 sts; join with a St St in 1st DC; 55 DC total Rounds 2-14: work around in DC as for the 1st Round, AT THE SAME TIME shaping the sleeve by decreasing 1 stitch in round $2,5,8,11$ and 14 . At the end of round 14, there'll be 50 DC
Rounds 15-19: begin increases; add 1 DC every round; at the end of round 19 there'll be 55 DC
Round 20-26: 3 CH (as 1st DC), DC in next 54 sts; join with a St St in 1st DC; 55 DC total
Round 27: one round of SC
Round 28: make a Scallop edging: *1 SC, skip 2 stitches, work 5 DC in the next stitch, skip 2 stitches, work 1 SC in next stitch*; repeat from ${ }^{*}$ to end of round; join to 1st SC with a St St and finish off.
size 3 years: work with grey-brown color.
Round 1-18: work same way as size 5 years old
Round 19: 3 CH (as 1st DC), DC in next 54 sts; join with a St St in 1st DC; 55 DC total
Round 20: change to edging color and work one round of SC
Round 21: make a Scallop edging: *1 SC, skip 2 stitches, work 5 DC in the next stitch, skip 2 stitches, work 1 SC in next stitch*; repeat from $*$ to end of round; join to 1st SC with a St St and finish off.

Left sleeve size 3 year old child

## Right sleeve - 5 years old

Work in rounds, shaping as for left sleeve and working throughout in one round of DC followed by one round of Holes. Use the same color sequence as on the yoke for the DC rounds, but work every Hole round in Light Green

Round 1: 3 CH (as 1st DC), 1 CH , skip 1 stitch, ${ }^{*} 1 \mathrm{DC}$ in next stitch, 1 CH , skip 1 stitch*; repeat from * around; join with a St St in 1st DC; 28 holes
Round 2: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{DC}$ in first hole, $* 2 \mathrm{DC}$ in every hole*, repeat around; join with a St St in 1st DC; 56 stitches
Rounds 3-7: repeat Rounds 2 and 3 two times, then round 2 once
Round 8: begin shaping the sleeve; 3 CH , work 1 DC in next hole, and 2 DC in every hole around to the last, working only 1 DC in last hole; join with a St St in 1st DC; 54 stitches
Round 9: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, *1 DC, 1 CH , skip 1 stitch*, repeat from * around; join with a St St in 1st DC; 27 holes
Round 10: 3 CH , work 1 DC in next hole, and 2 DC in every hole around to the last, working only 1 DC in last hole; join with a St St in 1st DC; 52 stitches
Round 11: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, ${ }^{*} 1 \mathrm{DC}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, repeat from $*$ around; join with a St St in 1st DC; 26 holes
Round 12: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{DC}$ in next hole, and 2 DC in every hole around to the last, working only 1 DC in last hole; join with a St St in 1st DC; 50 stitches
Round 13: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, *1 DC, 1 CH , skip 1 stitch, repeat from $*$ around; join with a St St in 1st DC; 25 holes
Round 14: begin increasing sleeve: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 2 \mathrm{DC}$ in next hole, then 2 DC in every hole around to the last, working 3 DC in last hole; join with a St St in 1st DC; 52 stitches
Round 15: 3 CH as 1 st $\mathrm{DC}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, ${ }^{*} 1 \mathrm{DC}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, repeat from * around; join with a St St in 1st DC; 26 holes

Round 16: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 2 \mathrm{DC}$ in next hole, then 2 DC in every hole around to the last, working 3 DC in last hole; join with a St St in 1st DC; 54 stitches
Round 17: 3 CH as 1 st $\mathrm{DC}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, ${ }^{*} 1 \mathrm{DC}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, repeat from * around; join with a St St in 1st DC; 27 holes

Round 18: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 2 \mathrm{DC}$ in next hole, then 2 DC in every hole around to the last, working 3 DC in last hole; join with a St St in 1st DC; 56 stitches
Round 19: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, ${ }^{*} 1 \mathrm{DC}, 1 \mathrm{CH}$, skip 1 stitch, repeat from $*$ around; join with a St St in 1st DC; 28 holes
Rounds 20-27: repeat rounds 18 and 19
Round 28: change color and work Scallop edging: *1 SC, skip 2 stitches, make 5 DC in 1 stitch, skip 2 stitches, 1 SC; repeat from * around; join to 1st SC with a St St; finish off

Right sleeve Size 3 years old
Work in rounds, shaping as for left sleeve and working throughout in one round of DC followed by one round of Holes. Use the same color sequence as on the yoke for the DC rounds, but work every Hole round in light pink

Rounds 1-19: work same way as size 5 years old,
Round 20: change to edging color and work one round of SC
Round 21: make a Scallop edging: *1 SC, skip 2 stitches, work 5 DC in the next stitch, skip 2 stitches, work 1 SC in next stitch*; repeat from $*$ to end of round; join to 1st SC with a St St and finish off.

Right sleeve size 3 year old child


## Finishing (both sizes)

Work one round SC around the front and neckline edges, skipping every 5th stitch along the neck edge to give the neckline a better look and fit. Work a second round to Scallop the edges as given for sleeves: *1 SC, skip 2 stitches, work 5 DC in the next stitch, skip 2 stitches, 1 SC, repeat from * around; join with a SI St in 1st SC and finish off.

## Detail of neckline shown below:

Neaten all loose ends. Sew buttons evenly spaced down the yoke, placing them opposite a gap in the Scallop edge.


Detail of finished neckline. Note that buttonholes are just gaps in the Scallop edging

## Flower motif

Make 5 petals and the flower center following the instructions below.


## Petal

Begin with 8 CH and work in rounds, don't turn your work
Round 1: 7 SC
Round 2: 1 CH , (3 SC, 1 HDC, $1 \mathrm{DC}, 5 \mathrm{DC}$ ) in last stitch, $1 \mathrm{DC}, 1 \mathrm{HDC}, 3 \mathrm{SC}$
Round 3: $1 \mathrm{CH}, 6$ SC, (2 SC in next stitch) 5 times, 6 SC, finish off

## The flower center

Round 1: 5 CH , join with a St St to form a ring
Round 2: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 9 \mathrm{DC}$ into the ring; join with a St St in 1st DC
Round 3: $3 \mathrm{CH}, 1 \mathrm{DC}$, (2 DC in next stitch) 9 times; join with a St St in 1st DC, finish off
Neaten loose ends and sew petals and flower center together. Embroider the flower with very basic embroidery stitches. You could make the same colorful flower as mine:-) Sew the flower to the left front side ... finished!! :-)
